I have always enjoyed the writings of Reverend James Harnish of Hyde Park UMC in Tampa, Florida. In his book *Journey to the Center of the Faith*, he relates the following: I remember the day in seventh-grade science class when the teacher...who had been around so long that our parents could remember calling him "pappy" ..demonstrated the gyroscope. It looked a lot like the metal top with the wooden plunger I set spinning on the linoleum-covered kitchen floor when I was a little boy. Like most adolescent boys with a healthy libido, my

seventh-grade scientific interests were more instinctively drawn to the anatomy of human reproduction, but this lesson in basic physics caught my attention. I watched in amazement as he positioned the spinning gyroscope on the very edge of his old wooden desk. He said it kept its precarious balance because its axis did not move. Keep that stable center, he said, and it could balance on anything. Lose that center, and it would go kaput.

He then goes on to say the following: The culture in which we live often feels like a spinning turntable on which people are pulled to the ideological edges and farther away from any common core of identity and belief. With this spinning gyre of change, I claim to be a Christian, a person who affirms a clear center defined by faith in God revealed in Jesus Christ. It is a center that can hold. Our center bears out the truth of our living.

We have been called to "bear witness" to the truth of Christ and to become the Gospel for the world. God's plan for the church is that people who "believe in Christ and strive to be more like him" will give themselves in witness and ministry for the sake of the Gospel and the building of the fellowship.

The Lord offers himself and cultivates a hunger for praise in the lives of his people. But the Lord does not say, "Open the doors and they will come." The Lord sends us out to gather the harvest. Our job is to help build the church. In the older Church calendars this time of year was called Kingdomtide. It's purpose was to speak about the church and work to strengthen the ministry. The color is green to symbolize a time of growth. It is a great time to be part of Lexington UMC. I sense that our church family is inviting others to come and experience who we are and what we do. We have people wanting to become members of the church. We have a larger Sunday attendance than when I first arrived. Sunday School classes are growing. Wednesday evenings have begun and our first week we had 140. What a great time to gather and eat a fantastic meal and then study. Adults and children together on the same night makes for a blessing. Our appreciation for one another is growing. I have not witnessed people being frustrated with one another or mean-spirited actions and that is a great thing since there is no place for that in the body of Christ. I see and feel a spirit moving among us. Our purpose is to love the Lord our God with all we have and to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. As our faith and witness grows so does the church. The invitation is to be ALL IN. When we share Loyalty Sunday in November we will present to God our commitments. For parents wanting to teach children about tithing we will provide a Child's Card where they can make their loyalty to the church known. All of us of every age and station need to consider PRAYING, ATTENDING, GIVING, SERVING, and WITNESSING. People desire to be part of a church where new things are happening and the Spirit is contagious. Let's grow our faith, our discipleship, and our church family.

The Lord has a plan for our church and there is no "plan B."

2018 Walk to End Alzheimer's - Columbia, SC Saturday, November 3, 2018, 9:30 am



I am excited that Lexington United Methodist church will have a Walk to End Alzheimer's team because we all have a reason to end Alzheimer's! I joined the Alzheimer's Association because I lost my grandmother, Daisy to this disease. My mother was her caregiver and I saw firsthand how devastating it is to watch a family member slowly forget you and everyone they love. It is such a horrible thing for a family to go through. I am a firm believer that we must raise awareness and money to fund research to beat this terrible disease while helping to

support local caregivers. My story is sadly one of many. Alzheimer's disease is a growing epidemic and the nation's 6thleading cause of death. Here in South Carolina, we have the highest mortality rate from Alzheimer's in the nation.

Every 65 seconds an American is diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and 89,000 people in South Carolina are living with Alzheimer's. At present over 5.7 million Americans are affected by this disease. This number is expected to triple by the middle of the century. The Alzheimer's Association is the leading voluntary health organization in Alzheimer's research. Our mission is to eliminate Alzheimer's disease through the advancement of research; to provide and enhance care and support for all affected; and to reduce the risk of dementia through the promotion of brain health.

The Alzheimer's Association Walk to End Alzheimer's is the biggest event for the Alzheimer's Association and is held every Fall in Columbia. The 2018 walk is on Saturday, November 3rd at Spirit Communications Park, 1640 Freed Dr., Columbia. 9 AM registration, 9:45 AM, opening ceremony. Our church team LUMC will gather at 9:30 am at Spirit Communications Park to show our support. There will be games for the kids, and visits from local mascots such as Cocky and Mason the Firefly!

Money raised for the Alzheimer's Association primarily remains local, providing a helpline staffed 24/7, respite assistance for families, educational programs, literature, newsletters, support groups, and other services free of charge to our community. A portion of all money raised goes to support research into the cause of and potential cures for Alzheimer's disease.

Participants will complete a two mile walk and will learn about Alzheimer's disease, advocacy opportunities, clinical studies enrollment and support programs and services from the Alzheimer's Association. My favorite part of Walk to End Alzheimer's is the Promise Garden ceremony, which starts at 9:45 AM before we set out on the 2-mile walk route. This uplifting activity gives each walker a brightly-colored Promise Garden flower representing their connection to the disease, which you can personalize with loved one's name or a message of hope. This pinwheel-style flower is yours to take home and 'plant' somewhere that you'll see it each time that it catches the wind.

Together, I know we can make big strides to fight this disease through Walk to End Alzheimer's. It's free to participate, whether you start a team or walk as an individual, and all donations support the mission of the Alzheimer's Association.
